

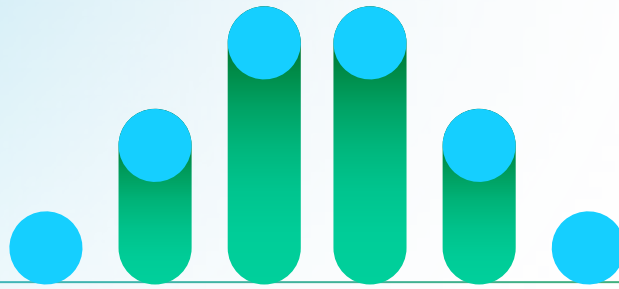

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Foreword

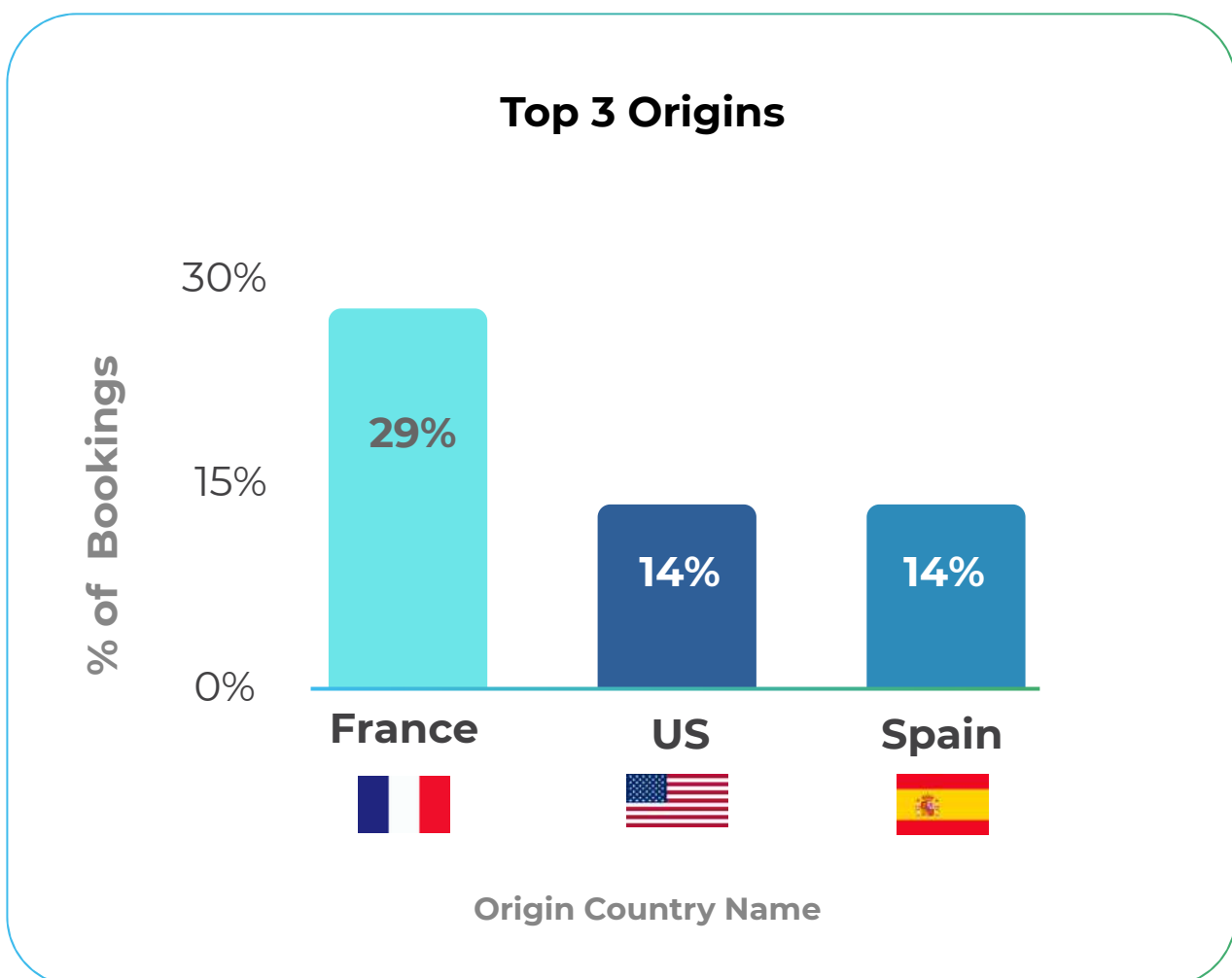
As Porto heads into the final quarter of 2025, travel patterns will reflect a mix of early planners, cross-border leisure demand, and long-haul stays. With nearly all major markets booking weeks in advance, car rental operators will need to anticipate fleet needs earlier than usual.

This report breaks down traveler origins, trip purposes, durations, group sizes, and pricing dynamics—helping rental businesses prepare smarter, align their strategies with traveler behavior, and capture margins during the crucial holiday travel season.



French Visitors Drive Porto's Travel Demand

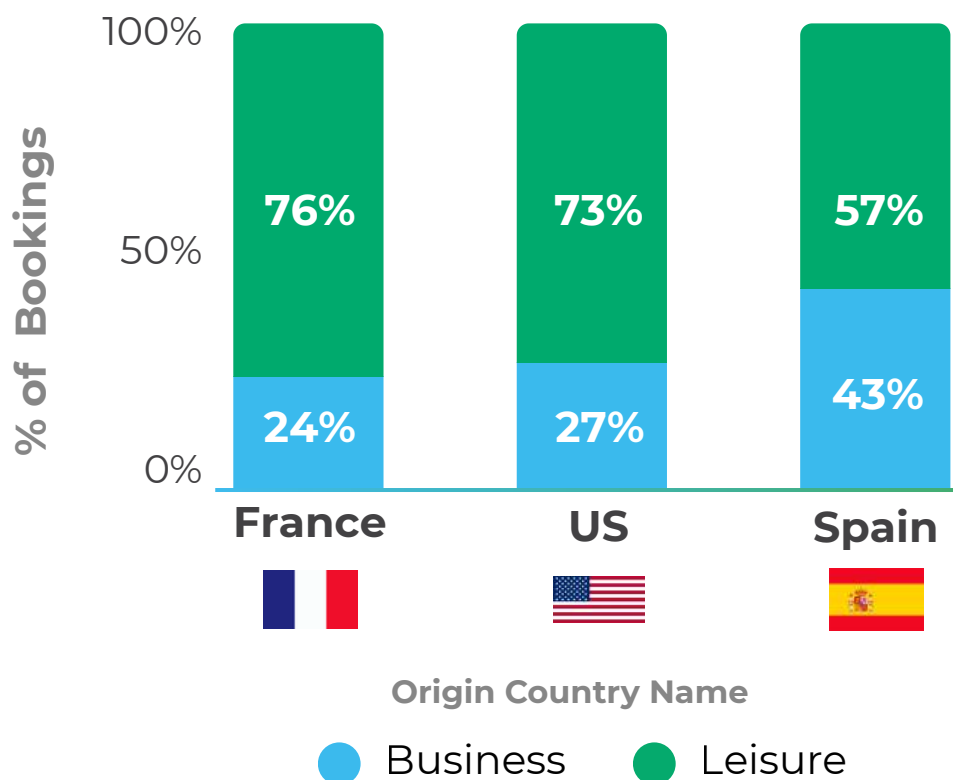
France leads with 29% of inbound demand, followed by the United States and Spain at 14% each. This combination gives Porto both steady regional traffic and high-value international travelers. For car rentals, this means preparing for a blend of short European city trips and longer, higher-spend stays from Americans.



Leisure Drives the Market, Spanish Business Adds Balance

Leisure is the overwhelming driver of travel to Porto this season. French visitors are 76% leisure-focused, while the U.S. sits close at 73% and Spain slightly lower at 57%. Business travel, while present, remains a smaller share across all three origins. Operators must therefore lean into holiday-driven offers, flexible packages, and tourism-focused add-ons to align with this demand.

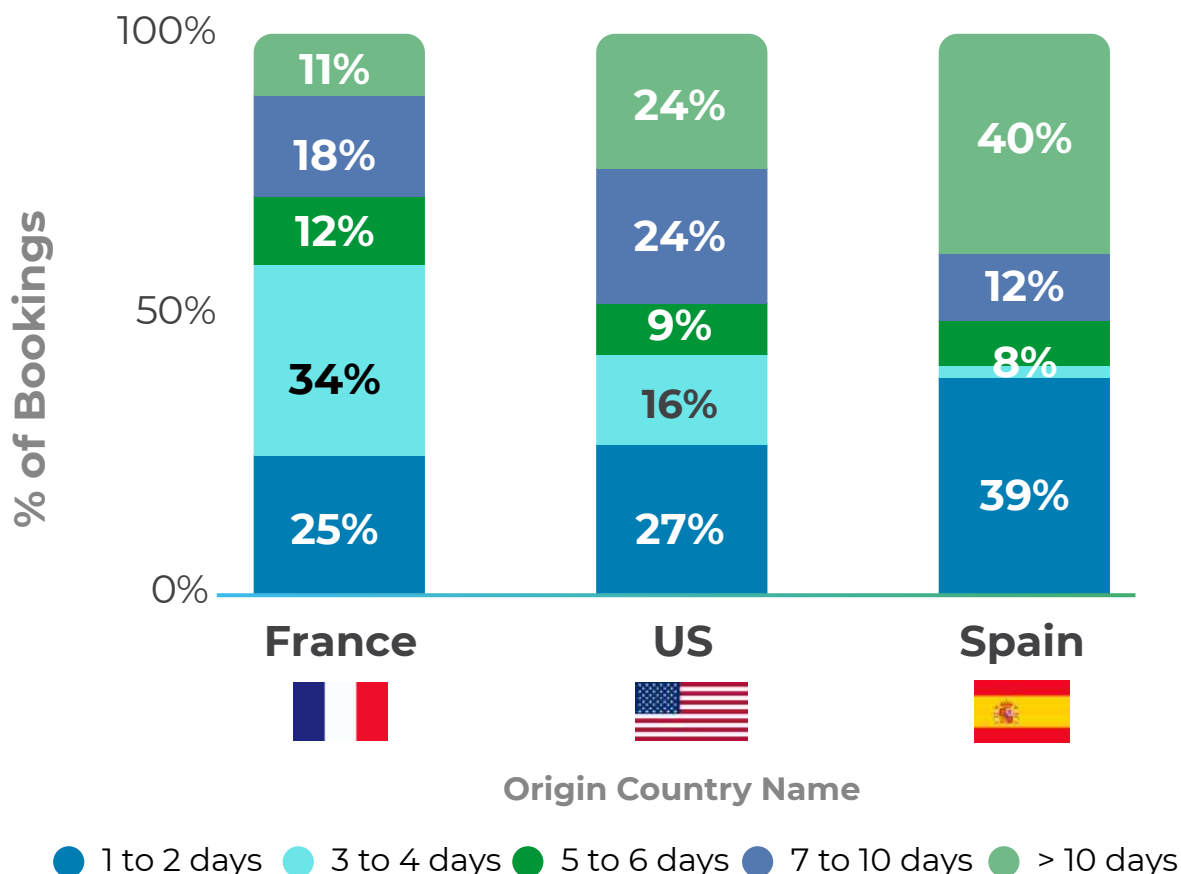
Reason for Travel by Top Origins



Spanish Short Stays vs. U.S. Long Holidays

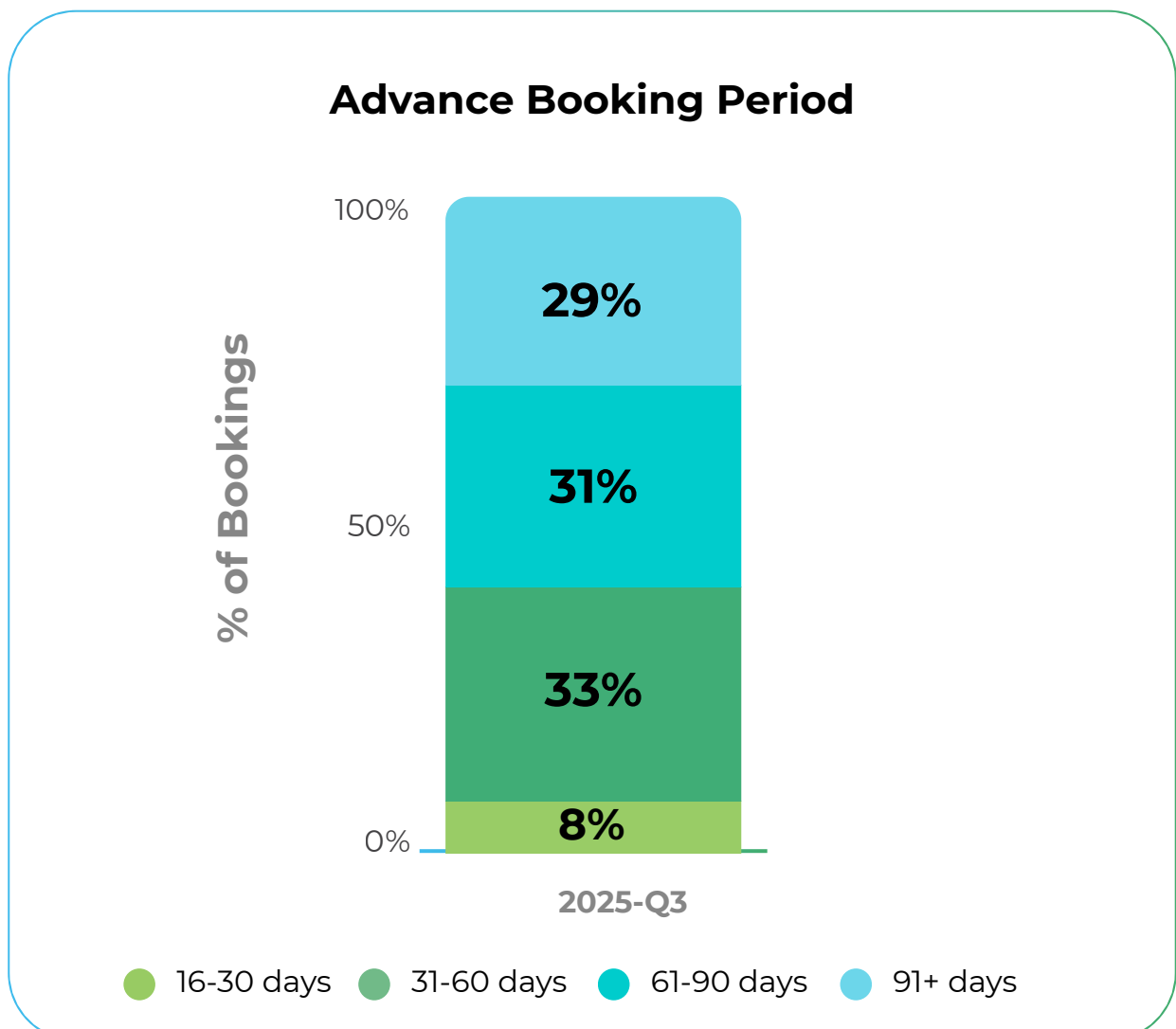
Spanish travelers will dominate both short and long stays. Meanwhile, Americans will be staying a week or longer and France will lean toward 3–4 day city breaks. Operators must therefore prepare fleets that can handle rapid turnover from Spanish city-breakers and longer-stay packages for French and U.S. visitors.

Trip Duration Category by Top Origins



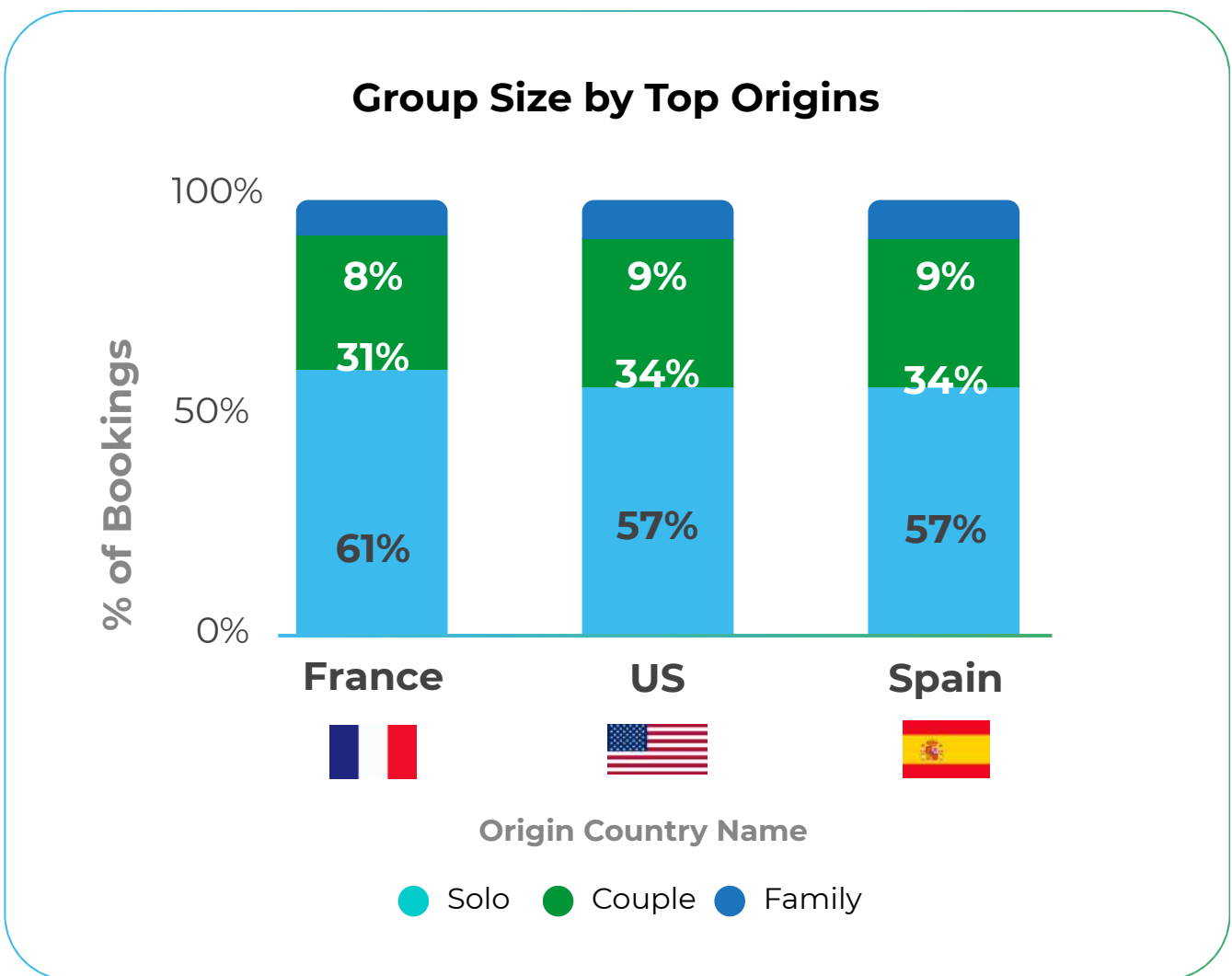
Porto Travelers Plan Far Ahead

Last-minute bookings will be rare in Porto, with only 8% reserving within 16–30 days, while a vast majority (over 90%) will confirm more than a month before travel. With 33% booking 31–60 days, 31% at 61–90 days, and 29% beyond 91 days, operators will need to secure demand early with advance deals and long-lead campaigns.



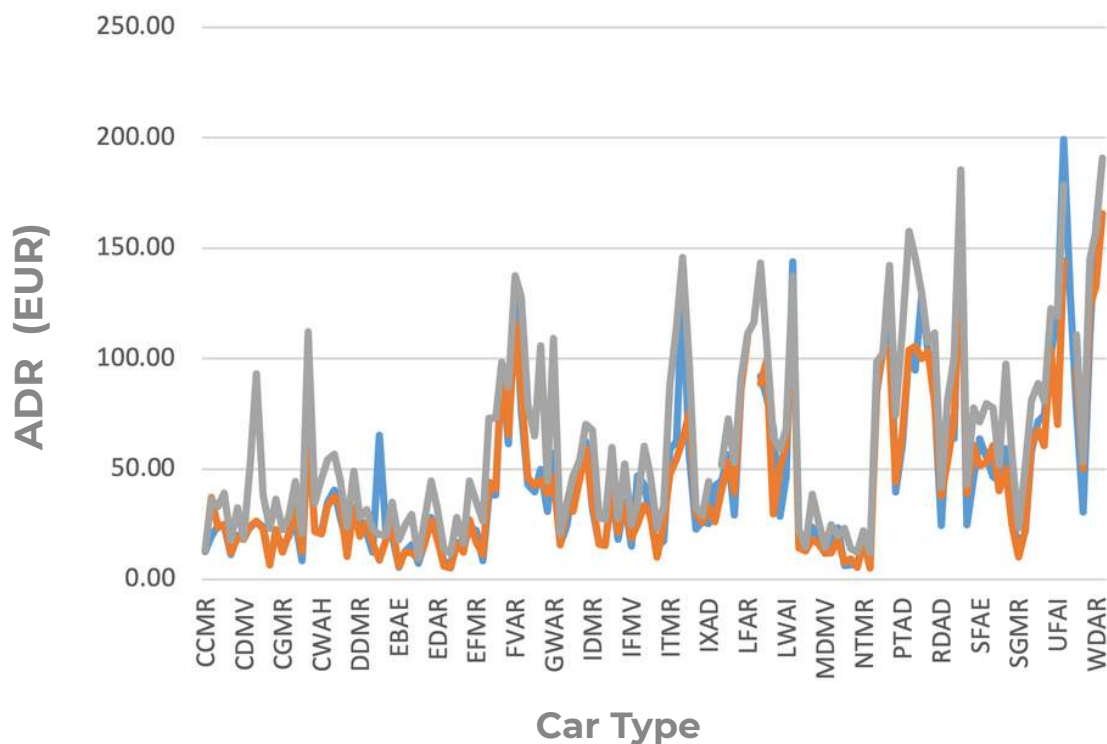
Solos Lead, Couples Close Behind

Most Porto travelers arrive solo or in pairs. Among the top three markets, 61% of French visitors, 57% of Americans, and 57% of Spaniards travel alone. Groups will remain limited (8–9%) yet important during the holiday peak, requiring some SUVs and vans alongside compact and mid-sized cars.



Porto's Rental Market Splits: Budget Steals vs. Premium Splurges

Porto's pricing landscape will stretch across extremes. Economy cars at EUR 5.24 will appeal to budget-conscious short-stay visitors. On the other hand, premium elite vehicles at EUR 199.19 will cater to long-haul Americans seeking comfort for extended holidays. Fleet balance will be crucial to capture both high volume and profit margins.
